

Wheelrights Routes Group

Notes of meeting/ride on 7th September 2019

in Ripples Café, Mumbles.

Present: Nick Guy (NG), Mike Lewis (ML), David Naylor (DN), Patrick Tribe (PT),
Chris Walsh (CW).

Apologies: John Sayce (JS)

1. **Matters arising** from 3 August meeting.

- (a) Gower Access Path. (Item 1b.) PT advised that due to local interest in this path there is a plan to set up an Information Centre. Cllr Lyndon Jones is hoping to arrange a meeting with the Council soon.

2. **Minor Works**

We went through the minor works list we had compiled at the last meeting, added to it and divided it into two priorities as follows: ([] = listing in section 3 of last meeting's notes.)

Priority 1.

- (a) NCR 4: Loughor Bridge. [a] Re-route western approach to the north side of Castle Road. Reopen issue of widening shared-use path on north side of bridge.
- (b) NCR 43 Mond crossing at Clydach. [d] Below standard: parallel crossing suggested.
- (c) Kingsbridge to A4240 path upgrade. [e] Upgrade and sign existing path.
- (d) Landore E-W link. [f] Upgrade crossing of A4067 to a Toucan and the footpath between it and the Morfa Relief Rd to shared use.
- (e) Cross Valley link. [i] Provide a Park and Bike facility at W. end, widen N. side path to improve access to NCR 43 and improve link to Morryston path across r'b't over A4067.
- (f) Railway Station. Signage and cycle access in immediate vicinity of station.

Priority 2.

- (a) NCR 4: Sterry Rd. [b] Provide a dropped kerb to take NCR 4 directly across Sterry Rd.
- (b) Advance Stop Lines. [c] List on the Infrastructure page of website now updated.
- (c) NCR 43 to N. Bank path link. [h] Along E. side of Nantong Way. (Already in pipeline?)
- (d) Clydach Rd under M4. [j] Add a path between Clydach Rd (B4603) and the A4067 to give cycle access under the M4. (If pos. upgrade the pedestrian bridge for cycle use)
- (e) Eaton Road. Upgrade existing cycle lane. (Key route north from station.)
- (f) Gwydr Square to Singleton Park. Make link via Oakwood Rd and Gwydr Cr. cycle friendly.
- (g) Terrace Rd. Make barriers at east end cycle friendly.

We noted the importance of the following route but were not sure if this was a 'minor work'.

Neath Rd – Morfa Relief Rd N-S link. [g] A means for cyclists to cross the busy B4603.

DN would submit the above to Ben George. **[Action: DN]**

3. **Cockett to Vivian Rd**

We considered JS's 3 Sept email which drew attention to the need for cycle provision at the impending £1m replacement of the roundabouts at the Vivian/Gower Rd junction by lights and the need for a cycle link along Cockett Rd to the Dylan Thomas school. We left it for individuals to survey this and email their suggestions to DN with a view to coming up with proposals to pass on to the Council. **[Action: All]**

4. **Tube (aka Network) map**

CW tabled a draft on which he requests feedback by 22 Sep. Specifically:

- Are there key nodes missing?
- Any important areas to add?
- Are the colours appropriate?
- Does the map align with our priorities? (Political issue.)

CW noted that a role for the Routes Group would be to select a preferred route between nodes and advise on the work involved. He proposes to share the map with Ben George and then bring it up at the next CAP (24 October). [Post meeting: DN has received the map from CW as a pdf and has put it on the Infrastructure page of the website.] **[Action: All]**

5. AOB

- (a) Santander Bikes. NG advised that BikeAbility have take over the servicing of these bikes. Fez would manage them.
- (b) Wheelrights meeting. NG advised that no speaker was planned for the meeting on 24 September but that we would be divided into three groups: 'Campaigning', 'Minor Works' and one other.
- (c) Liberty Stadium Cycle stands. PT reported that a new fence has blocked these stands but that there are plans to reinstate them. He will keep us informed. **[Action: PT]**

6. Next meeting.
